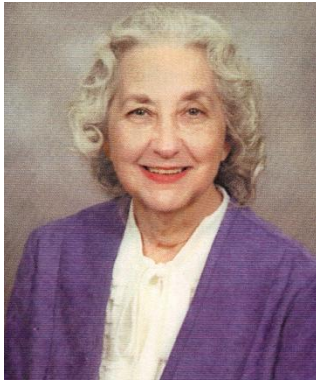

A Gift of Love



As was announced last Sunday, October 16th, Rosalind Kurch of blessed memory, entered into eternity on Friday, April 23, 2010, at the age of 75. Rosalind was a dedicated member of our English Choir and read the Epistle in church almost every Sunday for over 40 years. She read for the last time on Pascha – Easter Sunday, April 4, 2010.

Her love for the Church and our St. Vladimir parish was evident to all. Now, even in death, she continues to show that love by remembering our parish in her Last Will and Testament. Following her funeral, we were informed that 20% of her estate would be given to our parish, with the remaining 80% to be divided among 13 relatives named in the will.

The first installment of her gift, a check in the amount of \$14,241.00, was received last year. On October 12, 2011, we received the final check in the amount of \$61,277.00. The total of Rosalind's gift to the parish is \$75,518.00

We are most grateful to Rosalind and pray that Our Loving Lord will grant her peace and rest in His Heavenly Kingdom. May her memory be eternal! Vichnaya Pamyat!

With this gift, as with past gifts to our parish, we are reminded that our love for Christ's Holy Church and our St. Vladimir parish does not have to end when we die. It can continue with the gifts we leave in our wills. With this generous gift from Rosalind, it is evident that having a family does not hinder anyone from remembering the parish.
