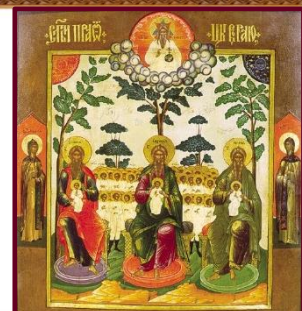

Caroling in Our Ukrainian Village

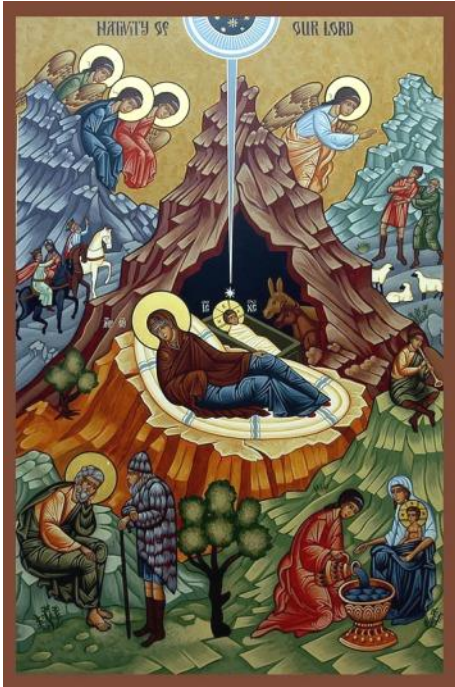
